Age 2 years and older

Materials Balloons (Safety note: put each balloon in pantyhose so

that if it pops, the pieces will be contained and children

cannot put them in their mouths.)

Setting Wide-open space indoors or outdoors

Description Everyone works together to keep the balloon up in the air

with their hands. Try not to let it touch the ground.

Learning Outcomes

Language and Literacy Toddlers listen to simple directions with understanding.

Movement Toddlers demonstrate balance and body coordination. They

are developing the ability to change positions smoothly as

they move.

Large Motor Skills Toddlers play actively in the indoor or outdoor setting.

ample opportunities to develop movement skills that will serve as the building blocks for future motor skillfulness and physical activity.
